REGULATIONS OF THE SOCIETY

1. Entries on the appropriate form to be duly signed and received by the Secretary together with the entry fee on or before 16 June 2017 for postal entries (19 June 2017 for online entries). Cheques/postal orders to be made payable to Malton Agricultural Society. The receipt of entries will not be acknowledged but passes and numbers will be sent to exhibitors prior to the show.
2. Entries received too late for inclusion in the programme will not be accepted. **No entries on the day; however, if you are already entered and wish to compete in other classes then we will accept the entry subject to class numbers.**
3. The Society reserves the right to extend the closing date for entries at its discretion, and to refuse any entry or withhold any prize if there appears to be insufficient merit in the exhibit.
4. Any ponies may be measured by the Veterinary Surgeon.
5. No horse or pony may be taken out of the Show Ring without permission of the Steward.
6. Heavy Horse turnouts will be inspected before entering the judging ring, for Health & Safety reasons.
7. The Society reserves the right to make amendments to the schedule up to the closing date for entries. Amendments will be published on the website. www.maltonshow.com
8. Anyone on a horse or pony must wear a hard hat of a standard approved by the governing body under whose rules they are exhibiting, and it must be properly fastened.
9. Safety – The safety of persons on the showground is of major concern to the Society. Precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present have been taken. Everyone must take reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents. All persons must obey the instructions of the Society's stewards, officials and staff and comply with any published safety instructions.
10. Challenge Cups: all cups must be returned to the Secretary at least 28 days prior to the next year's show.
11. Objections: All protests must be made to the Secretary in writing before the end of competition on the day of the show. Any person making an objection shall deposit at the time the sum of £10 which, at the discretion of the Council, may be forfeited to the funds of the Society in the event of the objection not being sustained, or if the objection be considered frivolous. In all cases of objection the decision of the Council shall be final.

Overall Award for Equine Section: Perpetual Silver Challenge Cup Presented by Major GRH Cholmley

This Cup is awarded to the Exhibitor who gains most points in the Horse Classes on the basis of 4 points for 1st prize, 3 points for 2nd prize, 2 points for 3rd prize and 1 point for 4th prize, where such prizes are awarded. In the event of any class with only one exhibitor, points will be limited to 4. In the event of a tie the exhibitor winning the most 1st prizes will be awarded the cup.

Affiliations

TSR: Qualify and enter ANY of the Finals Central, East Anglia, North West, North East, South East, South, Wales & South West or Scottish. You Do Not have to be a TSR member to qualify or enter a final. The Rider/Handler qualifies and can enter any horse/pony in any number of Finals!

TSR Riders Finals - 1st & 2nd riders qualify and will receive a qualification card in the ring.

TSR In Hand Finals - The two highest placed Handlers with a TSR In Hand Card will qualify in any In Hand class. Handlers MUST have their cards signed in the ring by the judge/steward, cards are available FREE from the TSR website. Full details at <http://www.theshowingregister.co.uk/>

TSR Medal Awards - TSR members can collect qualification cards & signatures and redeem for a TSR Medal see TSR website for details.

BSHA Grass Roots & SHGB Riding Club Champs - With a TSR qualification card you can also enter the BSHA Grass Roots Champs in Sept at Addington Equestrian Centre - You do not have to be a BSHA member to qualify or enter the final. See www.britishshowhorse.org PLUS the Sport Horse GB Riding Club Championship www.sporthorsegb.co.uk

The Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) will award Special Incentive Cards to the highest placed Irish Draught Pure Bred or Irish Draught Sport Horse in Classes 13-22 & 54-56. To be eligible exhibits must be registered with or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) on either their Irish Draught Breed Registers or Irish Draught Sport Horse Registers. Registration number to be stated on the entry form.

MALTON SHOW SUN 2 JULY – HORSE SCHEDULE

PONY CLASSES:

BSPS: This Show is affiliated to the **British Show Pony Society** (“B.S.P.S.”), 157/17 and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in B.S.P.S. classes, whether or not members of the B.S.P.S. are subject to the Rules of the B.S.P.S., including the disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the B.S.P.S.”

This Show is a qualifier for the 2017 B.S.P.S. Championships Show, to be held at Arena UK on 23-26 August.

All summer qualifying shows that are affiliated to the B.S.P.S. are qualifiers for the “**The B.S.P.S.**

Challenge” - Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Show Pony, SHP, WHP, Cradle Stakes, Nursery Stakes, Int SRT, SH, WH and Heritage M&M Lead Rein, First Ridden, Ridden & WHP This show is a qualifier for the B.S.P.S. Challenge. Animals must qualify for the Challenge by attending any B.S.P.S. affiliated Show and competing in the appropriate class.

NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part bred are not eligible for Mountain & Moorland Classes. To compete in Show Pony and Show Hunter Pony classes ponies must be registered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB, the GSB, the AHSB, the AASB or in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part-Breds are not eligible unless entered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 1st -3rd August 2017. The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified. NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner’s Membership cards **MUST** be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider’s/handler’s possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner’s membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 1st – 3rd August 2017.

Points for judging the Turnout class: turnout 50%, Performance of horses 50%

All horses and ponies to be 4 years old and over

Class 11 The Best Private Turnout (Singles, Pairs & Multiples)

Open to horses or ponies driven to a traditional or traditional type vehicle. A traditional vehicle means a vehicle of traditional profile and identifiable type to resemble the design of carriage built prior to the First World War. The vehicle may be made from modern materials but must have traditional style springing and carriage lamps. Pneumatic tyre vehicles, trade turnouts and show wagons are not eligible.

Class 12 Exercise Vehicle Class – 2 or 4 wheeled vehicles

Open to horses or ponies. A single, pair or tandem driven to a carriage of non-traditional type design and includes those with pneumatic tyres specifically designed for carriages (ie not car tyres). Lamps need not be carried. Judging will include general cleanliness, safety of turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability. Show wagons and commercial vehicles are not eligible.

Mare or gelding, 4 years and over, not to have won a 1st prize of £60 or a total of £200 (or equivalent values) in prize money in any ridden Hunter classes at home or abroad, before 1 January of current year, excepting all prize money awarded as a 4 year old. This does not apply to Novice Working Hunter classes

Class 14 Equifest Open Small Hunter

Open Ridden Small Hunter, 4 years old and over, mare or gelding exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 158cms. A horse which is registered as a Small Hunter cannot compete in an Open Weight Class. Rider any age.

Class 15 Black Country Saddles / Equifest Open Hunter

Mixed weight class. Ridden Hunter mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 153cms. Rider any age.

The two highest placed exhibits in Classes 14 & 15 not already qualified will qualify for the relevant **Equifest** championship to be held at the East of England showground on 9-13 August 2017)

Ridden Hunter Championship: 1st & 2nd prize winners in Classes 13-15 to compete.

BROODMARE VOUCHERS

A broodmare voucher worth £100 and rosette will be awarded in the Broodmare class(es) to the highest placed broodmare (1ST, 2ND OR 3RD placed) certified in foal OR with own foal at foot. The owner of the mare to reside in Yorkshire and the voucher to be used on any currently registered SHB (GB) graded stallion in either 2018 or 2019. The voucher is not transferable and no mare to win more than one voucher in each section (hunter breeding and sport horse), in any one season.

BREEDERS' PREMIUMS (FOALS AND YOUNGSTOCK)

1. Premiums – Foals

A stallion voucher worth £50 and rosette will be awarded to the breeder who must reside in Yorkshire, of the best foal (1st, 2nd or 3rd placed), sired by a graded SHB (GB) stallion currently registered in the year of covering OR out of an SHB graded mare. A foal may win ONE premium only in each section (hunter breeding and sport horse), in any one season.

2. Premiums – Youngstock

A stallion voucher worth £50 and rosette will be awarded to the breeder who must reside in Yorkshire, of the best yearling, two-year old and three-year old (1st, 2nd or 3rd placed), sired by a graded SHB (GB) stallion currently registered in the year of covering OR out of an SHB graded mare. A horse may win ONE premium only in each section (hunter breeding and sport horse), in any one season

3. Payment

There will not be a Yorkshire Sport Horse presence at any of the qualifying shows. Results will be obtained from the relevant shows and breeding details verified with Sports Horse Breeding of GB. The stallion voucher will then be sent to the breeder of the highest-placed (1st, 2nd or 3rd) animal in each class.

BREEDERS' CHAMPIONSHIP

These awards will be presented at the YSH Annual Dinner

SPORT HORSES

Broodmare Championship: The **BREEDER** of the Champion Sport Horse Broodmare will receive a Trophy.

Foal Championship: The **BREEDER** of the Champion Sport Horse Foal will receive a Trophy.

Young Stock Championship: The **BREEDER** of the Champion from 1,2 and 3-year-old Sport Horse classes will receive a Trophy.

These prizes are awarded at the end of the year to the Broodmare, Foals and Young Stock who have gained the most points at qualifying shows, i.e. 3 points for First, 2 for Second, 1 for Third. In the event of a tie, the horse with the most wins will take precedence.

Members to apply in writing to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card. The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 31st August-2nd September 2017. Shows held on or after the Postal Entry closing date of Championship Show will count as 2018 qualifiers. Classes 25 & 26 are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers. Open Show Pony, Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over exceeding 138cms but not exceeding 148cms. Suitable to be ridden by a rider not to have attained their 17th birthday before 1 January in the current year.

Class 28 BSPS Ridden Show Pony Summer Championship

Open Show Pony, Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over exceeding 128cms but not exceeding 138cms. Suitable to be ridden by a rider not to have attained their 15th birthday before 1 January in the current year.

Class 29 BSPS Ridden Show Pony Summer Championship

Open Show Pony, Mare or gelding, 4 years old and not exceeding 128cms. Suitable to be ridden by a rider not to have attained their 13th birthday before 1 January in the current year.

RIDDEN SHOW PONY CHAMPIONSHIP for 1st & 2nd prizewinners in Classes 27-29. The Champion will qualify for Binks Family BSPS Champion of Champions at the Summer Championship Show. Classes 27-29 are qualifiers for the NPS/Kellythorpe SP Open Ridden National Championship

Class 30 BSPS Open Lead Rein Pony Summer Championship

Open Lead Rein Pony, mare or gelding 4 years old and over not exceeding 122cms. To be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle. Lead rein to be attached to the noseband only. Riders not to have attained their 8th birthday before 1 January in the current year.

Class 31 BSPS Open First Ridden Pony Summer Championship

Open First Ridden Pony, mare or gelding 4 years old and over not exceeding 122cms. To be shown in any suitable snaffle bridle. Riders not to have attained their 10th birthday before 1 January in the current year.

MINI CHAMPIONSHIP for 1st & 2nd prize winners in classes 30 & 31. The Champion will qualify for the Binks Family BSPS Champion of Champions at the Summer Championship Show. Classes 30-32 are qualifiers for the NPS/Showing World Magazine Leading Rein & First Ridden National Championships

Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. **The first three** to qualify for the final at **RoR National Show at Aintree in August 2017**. All entries must be registered with RoR and **HAVE** raced in GB. Horses will **NOT** be ridden by the judge. **Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap**. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorse Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. **Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series**.
