Regulations for the Exhibition.

ENTRIES

1. Entries on the appropriate form, to be duly signed and received by the Secretary together with the Entry Fees on or before 12th June 2015 for Horse and livestock (28th June for Show Jumping) , 20th June for Horticulture, handicraft, photography and childrens section . Cheques and Postal Orders to be made payable to "Malton Agricultural Society". The receipt of Entries will not be acknowledged but Entry Badges will be sent to Exhibitors at least three days previous to the Show. NUMBERS SHOULD BE COLLECTED FROM THE SECRETARY'S TENT ON SHOW DAY IF ENTRY FEES NOT PAID
2. ENTRIES RECEIVED TOO LATE FOR INCLUSION IN THE CATALOGUE WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
3. The Society reserve the right to extend the closing date for entries at their discretion, and to refuse any entry or withhold any prize if there appears to be insufficient merit in the exhibit.
4. If less than three entries are forward, a second prize only will be awarded, unless in the opinion of the Judge a first prize is warranted.
5. Substitutes will only be allowed at the discretion of the Show Council and in any case details must be in the hands of the Secretary by 9.00 am on the day of the Show.
6. All stock entered for competition must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor. All stock must be available at the time stated for Judging, and every effort will be made to maintain the timetable, but the Council reserve the right to make alterations. Exhibitors in the Sheep classes must be prepared to present their sheep for judging when required to do so by the Stewards.
7. No exhibit shall be removed from the Showground until 4.30 pm
8. Any Ponies may be measured by the Veterinary Surgeon.
9. No animal may be taken out of the Show Ring without permission of the Steward.
10. Heavy Horse Turnouts will be inspected before entering Judging ring, for Health & Safety reasons.
11. All winning exhibits must be available to exhibit in the Grand Parade at 2.30pm. Failure to do so will result in a forfeit of prize money.
12. the Society reserves the right to make amendments to the schedule up to the date of entries closing, amendments will be published on the website (www.maltonshow.com)

CHALLENGE CUPS

13. All Challenge cups must be returned to the Secretary at least 28 days previous to the Show following at which awarded.

OBJECTIONS

14. All protests must be made to the Secretary in writing before 4.00 pm on the day of the Show. Any person making a protest shall at the time deposit the sum of £10, which Shall, at the discretion of the Council, be forfeited to the funds of the Society in the event of the objection not being sustained, or if the objection be considered frivolous.
15. In all cases of objection the decision of the Council shall be final.

CATTLE

Entries must state Registered Name, Herd Book Number and Date of Birth in respect of each animal on the Entry Form.

Cattle Passports

All Cattle must be accompanied to and from the Show by their passport duly completed. The correct Holding Number (CPH) for the Showground must be used.

Brucellosis

Great Britain is Officially Brucellosis Free (OBF). Cattle under temporary Defra restrictions and recently imported cattle undergoing testing in isolation to reach OBF status will not be accepted.

NORMAL FULL TERM CALVINGS

Animals which calve or show evidence of being about to calve whilst at the showground must be placed in the approved isolation accommodation, pending their possible early removal from the showground.

Where an animal calves at full term, the animal may return to the show lines, at the discretion of the Show Veterinary surgeon, ONLY IF the owner has arranged for a blood sample and a vaginal swab to be taken and examined at an approved laboratory, and both the ELISA blood test and microscopical examination of the smear have proved negative.

ABORTIONS AND PREMATURE CALVINGS

Where an animal CALVES PREMATURELY or ABORTS, the local DVM must be informed immediately. The animal must be placed in the approved isolation under BS27 restrictions and the full range of required samples taken. The animal will not be allowed to take further part in the Show and, once it is fit to travel, can be returned home to the registered premises or alternatively retained until the end of the Show in isolation and returned with the other competing cattle from the same premises.

No other cattle from the same registered premises will be allowed to compete further in the Show until negative test results have been received. They can be returned with the suspect animal at the end of the Show.

Enzootic Bovine Leucosis (EBL)

Great Britain is Officially EBL Free. Entries will not be accepted from herds within which EBL is suspected, or of cattle undergoing a period of post-import isolation.

PERPETUAL SILVER CHALLENGE CUP

SAC Sheep Health Scheme

MV Accredited Classes

Suffolk & British Charollais. Only full MV Accredited sheep will be accepted.

MV Accredited & Non MV Accredited Classes:

Leicester, Texel, Lleyn, Any Other Continental Breeds, Rare Breeds, Any Other Native Breeds, Ryeland & Coloured Ryeland. Please ensure you mark clearly on the entry form MV Accredited or Non MV Accredited.

Non MV Accredited Classes:

Blue Faced Leicester, Jacobs, Fat Lambs & Non Predigree sheep.

Separate accommodation and unloading/loading points will be provided for both categories. Non-accredited and MV Accredited sheep must travel to and from the Show in separate transport unless they are separated by solid partitions in the vehicle and the vehicle has separate unloading ramps/doors. If any MV Accredited sheep come into close contact with non-accredited sheep, they will lose their status and on return to their own or other Scheme premises, assume the status of the contact sheep. Generally this will require isolation and testing until the status is regained. Separate rings will be provided for MV Accredited and non-accredited sheep. Provided that these requirements are followed MV Accredited sheep will not lose their status and will not require post movement testing on return. MV Accredited sheep being presented at shows must be accompanied by a valid SAC MV Certificate (please note expiry date) stating number and type of sheep. These Certificates are available from the SAC in Inverness and must be presented to either the official Veterinary Surgeon or the Chief Steward, Mrs Lizzie Bentley, or her nominee before the sheep are allowed into the accommodation provided for MV Accredited Sheep.

N.B. MV Accredited Stock must be accompanied by a valid SAC Certificate (of status) which must be given to the Chief Steward or Mrs A Welham, and the Secretary will then return them to The Sheep Health Scheme.

Will all Sheep Exhibitors PLEASE STATE on their Entry Form if their sheep are MV Accredited.

Short tail docking of sheep

Exhibitors are reminded that sufficient tail must be retained to cover the vulva of female sheep and the anus of male sheep.

Defra Scrapie Monitoring Scheme

Exhibitors attending the Show must either:

- i) Produce a registration certificate proving that they are Scrapie monitored
- or
- ii) Produce a declaration that the sheep/goats are :
 - a) Non-Pregnant and
 - b) Have not lambed/kidded within 30 days prior to the Show

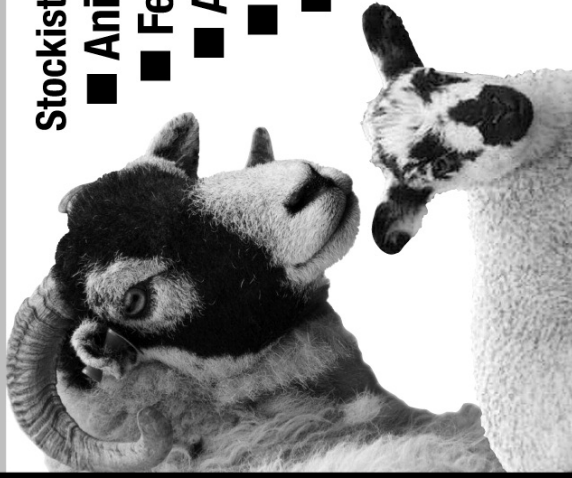

SHOW REGULATIONS

1. The ages of exhibits will be calculated to the date fixed for the closing of entries unless otherwise stated.
2. All entries to be made in writing to the Secretaries, and each exhibitor shall Sign such certificates as shall be required by the Secretaries at the time of entry. All exhibits must be bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry.
3. All Entrance Fees to be paid at the time of entry. No entry will be accepted without payment of the prescribed fee
4. Any animals that are Judged may leave the Show Ground at 5.00 pm.
5. All exhibits of Poultry, Pigeons and Rabbits must be penned by 9.30 am; Produce, Horticulture by 10 am on the morning of the Show, and must not be removed before 5 pm, unless by special permission of the Secretary. JUDGING COMMENCES AT 10 AM.
6. No exhibitors of Poultry, Pigeons, Rabbits etc. will be allowed to remove exhibits from their Pens without the permission of a Steward. Nor will any exhibitor be allowed to display any form of advertisement on any pens or cages. Any person infringing this rule will be fined £1 for each pen so tampered with, and forfeit any prize money, if awarded. This rule will be strictly enforced.
7. In no case will the Society be responsible for the safety of exhibits or packages, nor for any loss that may occur to them from any cause whatsoever, but every care will be taken.
8. All claims for Exhibits in Selling Classes etc. must be made to the Secretary, before 3.30 pm on the day of the Show. A Commission of 10% will be charged on all sales. If any exhibit is claimed by two or more persons it will be sold by auction on the Showground at 3.45 pm. Any amount realised beyond the catalogue price will be divided between the Exhibitor and the Society except in Selling Classes in which classes the whole of the surplus shall go to the Society.
9. Any person who has given a false certificate or made a false entry shall forfeit any unpaid prize money and shall be disqualified from exhibition at the Society's Shows.
10. No person other than appointed Stewards shall be in any Marquee during Judging.
11. The Fancy Pigeon Section is held under N.P.A. Rules.
12. All Exhibits must have been grown by the Exhibitor, except in Floral Art Section. Any violation of this Rule or any other Rules of the Show render the Exhibitor liable to disqualification, and forfeit all prizes that have been awarded to such exhibitor. The Committee reserve the right to inspect the gardens of the Exhibitor in all Horticultural Classes.
13. Staging will be erected by the Committee, but Exhibitors must providointed Steward. No professional assistance allowed.
14. The Committee will not be held responsible for any loss or damage to any exhibits but will use every care for their safety.
15. The Judges, whose decision shall be final, will have the power to reserve or reduce the prizes where exhibits shall be considered not to possess sufficient merit or recommend the addition of extra prizes.
