## REGULATIONS OF THE SOCIETY

1. Entries on the appropriate form to be duly signed and received by the Secretary or made online together with the entry fee on or before Tuesday 24 June 2025. Cheques/postal orders to be made payable to Malton Agricultural Society. The receipt of entries will not be acknowledged but passes and numbers will be sent to exhibitors prior to the show.

2. Entries received too late for inclusion in the programme will not be accepted. No entries on the day; however, if you are already entered and wish to compete in other classes then we will accept the entry subject to class numbers.

3. The Society reserves the right to extend the closing date for entries at its discretion, and to refuse any entry or withhold any prize if there appears to be insufficient merit in the exhibit.

4. Any ponies may be measured by the Veterinary Surgeon.

5. No horse or pony may be taken out of the Show Ring without permission of the Steward.6. Heavy Horse turnouts will be inspected before entering the judging ring, for Health & Safety reasons.

7. The Society reserves the right to make amendments to the schedule up to the closing date for entries. Amendments will be published on the website. www.maltonshow.com

8. Anyone on a horse or pony must wear a hard hat of a standard approved by the governing body under whose rules they are exhibiting, and it must be properly fastened.

9. Safety – The safety of persons on the showground is of major concern to the Society. Precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present have been taken. Everyone must take

reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents. All persons must obey the instructions of the Society's stewards, officials and staff and comply with any published safety instructions.

PLEASE NOTE - IT IS A CONDITION OF ENTRY THAT ALL EXHIBITORS HAVE PUBLIC

<u>LIABILITY INSURANCE. SIGNATURE/ACCEPTANCE TO BE GIVEN ON ENTRY FORM.</u> 10. Challenge Cups: all cups must be returned to the Secretary at least 28 days prior to the next year's show.

11. Prize money – if 3 or less exhibitors catalogued, prize money will only be awarded to 1<sub>st</sub> Place only, if between 4-6 exhibits are catalogued 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> will be awarded, anything over 6 exhibits catalogued 1<sup>st</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> will be awarded. <u>ALL PRIZE MONEY TO BE COLLECTED FROM</u> <u>SECRATARYS TENT. IF NOT COLLECTED ON THE DAY YOU WILL FORFIT YOU PRIZE MONEY</u> BACK TO THE CHARITY.

12. Objections: All protests must be made to the Secretary in writing before the end of competition on the day of the show. Any person making an objection shall deposit at the time the sum of £50 which, at the discretion of the Council, may be forfeited to the funds of the Society in the event of the objection not being sustained, or if the objection be considered frivolous. In all cases of objection, the decision of the Council shall be final.

13. VACCINATIONS - All horses/ ponies competing are expected to be vaccinated against equine influenza as follows, a) Two injections for the primary vaccination not less than 21 days or more than 92 days apart. Both are required before a horse/ pony may compete.

b) A booster injection given 150 – 215 days after the second injection of the primary vaccination c) Subsequent booster injections must be given each year, within and not exceeding the one year period, commencing after the first booster injection.

## **Overall Award for Equine Section:**

Perpetual Silver Challenge Cup

Presented by Major GRH Cholmley

This Cup is awarded to the Exhibitor who gains most points in the Horse Classes on the basis of 4 points for 1<sub>st</sub> prize, 3 points for 2<sub>nd</sub> prize, 2 points for 3<sub>rd</sub> prize and 1 point for 4<sub>th</sub> prize, where such prizes are awarded. In the event of any class with only one exhibitor, points will be limited to 4. In the event of a tie the exhibitor winning the most 1<sub>st</sub> prizes will be awarded the cup.

#### Affiliations

This show is affiliated to the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) and as such, any horses competing in Classes 54 - 56 must be eligible under the below criteria:-

- All horses must be registered with or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and in the <u>correct</u> ownership
- NEW: Owners of Pure bred Irish Draughts and Irish Draught Sport Horses/Part bred) must now be full members of the IDHS (GB) to compete
- Irish Draught Sport Horses/Part bred are horses that have a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding
- In hand breeding classes

- MARES with foals at foot, 3 years and over must be inspected and classified as Class 1 (or RID), Class 2 or Supplementary Grade Up (or AID)
- Youngstock must be the progeny of a Graded Mare (Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB), AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) and be by a Class 1, 2 or RID (GB) stallion on the Irish Draught Breed Register.
- Pure bred ID and ID Sport Horse / Part bred, 3 year old colts must be un-inspected
- All 1, 2 & 3 year old colts <u>must</u> be bitted and shown by experienced handlers over 18 years of age
- All pure-bred Irish Draught Stallions
  - o must be inspected and overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and be Class 1, 2 or RID (GB).
  - Stallions must display a red, white and blue ribbon in their tails and be shown by experienced rider/handlers over 18 years of age
- Ridden horses must be 153cm (15hh) or over.

#### GENERAL QUALIFIER INFORMATION:

- The Finals of all IDHS (GB) qualifiers will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show on 6th & 7th September 2025 at Onley Equestrian Centre, Onley Grounds Farm, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire CV23 8AJ.
- All owners of qualified horses will be contacted by a member of the IDHS (GB) Show Affiliation Team
- Horses can only qualify for a specific Final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered
- See respective qualifying classes for relevant details of the Finals

## PONY CLASSES:

This Show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society ("B.S.P.S."), and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in B.S.P.S. classes, whether or not members of the B.S.P.S. are subject to the Rules of the B.S.P.S., including the disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the B.S.P.S

This Show is a qualifier for the 2025 B.S.P.S. Championships Show, to be held at Arena UK

This show is a qualifier for the B.S.P.S. Challenge. Animals competing in the following Open classes will qualify: - Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Show Pony, SHP, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WHP, Intermediate SRT, SH and WH and Open Heritage Lead Rein, First Ridden, Ridden and WHP classes

This show is a qualifier for the B.S.P.S. Binks Family Champion of Champions the 1<sup>st</sup> prize winners in the following classes will qualify:- Open Lead Rein, Open First Ridden, Open Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Open Show Pony, SHP, WHP, Intermediate SRT, SH and WH and Open Heritage Lead Rein, First Ridden, Ridden and WHP classes

<u>NPS Qualifying Rounds</u>: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB, or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part breds are not eligible unless over stamped into one of the British Riding Pony studbook sections. or the Ridden Register.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and nonmembers but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for

the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from  $5^{th} - 7^{th}$  August 2025.

The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified. NPS/WTJ Insurance Brokers Ltd Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards **MUST** be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

**NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships:** These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships.

**This Show is a qualifier for the NPS Area 4 In Hand Final:** sponsored by "Gowland Plumbing Services". The Champion and Reserve Champion from the Riding Pony Breeding, Hunter Pony Breeding and Mountain & Moorland In Hand Classes will qualify for the Final to be held on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> August 2025 at the NPS Area 4 Summer Show. Qualifiers do not have to be Members of the NPS.

NCPA: This show is a qualifier for the N.C.P.A. Pony of the Year Show in September. First and second prize winners in appropriate classes will qualify.

#### HOYS UKAMHS Qualifier:

Exhibitors, owners, and handlers must be current members of the UKAMHS. All competitors must have filled out a showing declaration form and paid the appropriate UKAMHS 2025 Showing Levy Fee. All horses must be nominated with UKAMHS

All exhibits must be registered with the American Miniature Horse Association (AMHA), the American Miniature Horse Registry (AMHR), or the AMHCGB Studbook (Section A/Purebred). Horses must measure appropriately for their age and cannot exceed 34 inches in height. Exhibits must have been measured at a UKAMHS approved measuring clinic or show prior to entering a qualifier.

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

#### CHAPS

This show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK). Affiliation No: 25-104 Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However in order to Qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and have a valid Qualifier card. Members to apply in writing to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card. The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 14 – 16th August 2025. Shows held after the 6<sup>th</sup> Aug will count as 2026 qualifiers. Classes 28 - 34 are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers. #### Class 12 The Best Private Driving Turnout (Singles, Pairs & Multiples)

Open to horses or ponies driven to a traditional or traditional type vehicle. A traditional vehicle means a vehicle of traditional profile and identifiable type to resemble the design of carriage built prior to the First World War. The vehicle may be made from modern materials but must have traditional style springing and carriage lamps. Pneumatic tyre vehicles, trade turnouts and show wagons are not eligible.

#### Class 13 Exercise Vehicle Class – 2 or 4 wheeled vehicles

Open to horses or ponies. A single, pair or tandem driven to a carriage of nontraditional type design and includes those with pneumatic tyres specifically designed for carriages (ie not car tyres). Lamps need not be carried. Judging will include general cleanliness, safety of turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability. Show wagons and commercial vehicles are not eligible.
